Although restaurants are projected add nearly a half-million summer jobs in 2017, hiring will be somewhat dampened compared to recent years, according to the NRA's chief economist Bruce Grindy. His Economist's Notebook commentary and analysis appears regularly on Restaurant.org and Restaurant TrendMapper.

Restaurants are expected to add 490,000 jobs this summer season, according to the National Restaurant Association's 19th Annual Eating and Drinking Place Summer Employment Forecast.

Summer is the busiest season for restaurants in many parts of the country, and the stronger business leads to additional employment opportunities at all levels of a restaurant operation.

Food industry on steady growth path through 2022: report

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Dive Brief:

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- Growth of the U.S. food industry is expected to progress at a CAGR of 2.9% through 2022, according to the 2016 Food Packaging Trends and Advances report from PMMI, the Association for Packaging and Processing Technologies.
- The report predicts snacks, plus meat and meat-related product, segments will outperform the overall industry at 3% growth due to consumer preferences for convenience and portion control.
- Manufacturers with an international presence will see even faster growth in certain regions, particularly emerging markets like Argentina, Brazil, China, and India. Global growth rates for most segments are double the rates in the U.S., except meat and related products (8.5%) and candy and confections (8%), which are even higher.
